

Tapori is a worldwide network of children whose motto is:

"We want all children to have the same chances!"

The name Tapori was chosen by **Joseph Wresinski** as a sign of solidarity with the poorest children. Joseph Wresinski founder of the **International Movement ATD Fourth World** grew up in poverty.

While travelling in India, he met very poor children called *Taporis* who lived in train stations and who supported each other. He later wrote to other children:

"You are like Taporis when you look out for others.

You can find ways to make a world a better place and get rid of poverty."

Today, thousands of children between 7 and 13 years old, across many different countries and continents, are connected through the Tapori newsletter.


