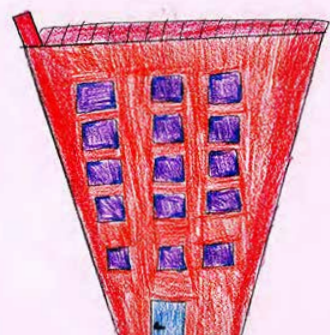
Children from a school in **Legnica in Poland**, heard **the story of Laetitia from Switzerland** and then drew houses and sent messages for other children around the world.

What about you? Can you tell us a child's story, a story that touched you?

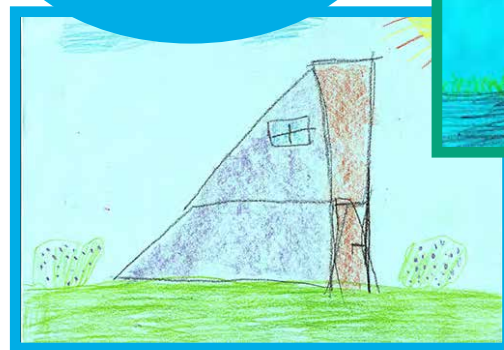
